*EXAMPLE Covid-19 Action Card

Transfer of patient to Radiology for CT Scan

1 Overview

For patients who are at risk of having Covid-19 and require CT scanning

2 Activation

Advised by Medical Staff who should take the following actions:

- 1. Identify patient as requiring a CT scan
- 2. Make a request justifying need for imaging plus highlighting Covid-19 'at risk' patient
- 3. Discussion with a Radiologist

3 Procedure

Upon receipt of request, CT Co-ordinator to take the following actions:

- 1. Identify suitably trained and fit-tested staff to undertake CT scan 3 staff ideal, 2 to wear PPE and have contact with patient, and 1 to remain non-contact
- 2. Identify CT scanner that is most appropriate
- 3. Liaise with clinical team to arrange time for CT scan (ideally end of list) and the preferred route which will be taken
- 4. Inform site team patient needs transfer to CT and is a potential Covid-19 patient
- 5. Inform the cleaning department of the need for a 'deep clean' after the CT scan
- 6. The clinical team looking after the patient will be responsible for transporting the patient to/from the CT department. Patient should wear a surgical mask if tolerated and should not wait in a communal area.
- 7. The transfer trolley and other equipment will all require decontamination
- 8. During transfer individuals not wearing PPE should be >2m from the patient
- 9. Allocate staff accordingly and ensure correct PPE available
- 10. At allocated time ensure that:
 - o CT scanner being used is clear of patients
 - o Nearby patients and staff are removed from the area
 - o Only essential staff, with PPE, present in CT scanner and control room
- 11. When patient has been scanned, ensure that the area and exit route is clear as before, allowing quick exit from the scanner

Stand Down

Once patient confirmed as no longer at risk, patients can present to Radiology for imaging, providing that their clinical condition dictates this
