## Just Steps from The Bridgewater Hall: Manchester at its Best

### The Bridgewater Hall (0 minutes!)

You're already in one of the UK's finest concert venues—home to the **Hallé Orchestra** and a year-round programme of classical, film scores, and touring performances. ## **Manchester Art Gallery (5–7 minutes)**

Right around the corner, **Manchester Art Gallery** is one of the city's cultural crown jewels. Inside, you'll find:

- A superb collection of **Pre-Raphaelite masterpieces**
- Contemporary works and rotating exhibitions
- Beautiful historic architecture with light-filled spaces

## **Manchester Central Library (3 minutes)**

A must-visit right by the square, this beautifully restored circular building is much more than a library:

## **Manchester Central & Castlefield Canals (5–10 minutes)**

Head just past the Hall and you'll reach **Manchester Central** (formerly the historic railway station) and then into **Castlefield**:

- Peaceful canals with iron bridges and old warehouses
- A fascinating glimpse into Manchester's **industrial heritage**
- Atmospheric pubs and waterside walkways
- National Trust Victorian-era former railway viaduct now transformed into Manchester's 'garden in the sky'

Castlefield is especially magical in early evening light—quiet, scenic, and full of character.

## Science and Industry Museum (8–10 minutes)

One of Manchester's most exciting and distinctive attractions:

- Built on the **site of the world's first passenger railway station**
- Fascinating exhibitions on **industrial history, science, and innovation**

## John Rylands Library (≈ 10 minutes)

## Albert Square (5–7 minutes)

## St Ann's Square (7–9 minutes)
